Tourism Australia sends a message in the sand

The seventy by forty metre artwork was drawn in the sand on Raafs Beach near Geelong, Victoria, with the 'We will meet again' message referencing words spoken by The Queen of England in her national address to the United Kingdom as the country entered its first Covid-19 lockdown earlier this year. The artwork also includes Tourism Australia's 'With Love from Aus' message that has featured in marketing and social media content throughout the year.
